


## WHAT IS THE CATHEDRAL MINISTRY CONFERENCE?



The Cathedral Ministry Conference (www.cathedralministry.org) is a biennial meeting of those involved in ministry in Cathedrals and Basilicas throughout North America. Past conferences held in Orlando, San Antonio, New Orleans, Los Angeles, Seattle, St. Augustine, Milwaukee, Salt Lake City, Minneapolis/St. Paul, and Santa Fe have been great successes, allowing cathedral pastors/rectors, musicians, and lay ministers to meet, interact, pray, learn, and be renewed in ministry together. As in past years, the 2026 Cathedral Ministry Conference will offer three stellar keynote presentations that will be of interest to all who are engaged in cathedral ministry

as well as workshops aimed at a variety of more particular interests and concerns. The conference provides time for networking and fellowship with other cathedral ministers from around the country. This is a unique opportunity to share ideas with counterparts from cities large and small around the United States. ## SAN FERNANDO CATHEDRAL, SAN ANTONIO



San Fernando Cathedral was founded on March 9, 1731 by a group of 16 families who came from the Canary Islands at the invitation of King Phillip V of Spain and is the oldest, continuously functioning religious community in the State of Texas. This church was planned to be at the center of life in this city. The Cathedral building has the added distinction of being the oldest standing church building in Texas, and for all of its more than 281 years, has been serving the people of the Archdiocese and San Antonio. For almost 95 years, San Fernando served as the church for all of the religious denominations of San Antonio as the Catholic Church was the only recognized religion of the Spanish and Mexican governments prior to Texas' independence. San Fernando has become more than the geographic center; it has become an ecumenical, cultural, civic, and service center of unity and harmony for

all the God-loving people of San Antonio and beyond. San Fernando serves as a refuge for many of the poor in this area who come for help and trust their needs will be met. As the first church in the city, San Fernando has a rich history of responding to the people's needs in and around the church.

## THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO



San Antonio is notable for its diversity, its incredibly rich history, and its vibrant culture. It is home to the Alamo, an historic site and a symbol of the Texas Revolution. San Antonio also boasts a UNESCO World Heritage Site, the San Antonio Missions National Historical Park, which includes four 18th-century Spanish missions. The city is known for its lively River Walk, a popular tourist destination with shops, restaurants, and water taxis. Additionally, San Antonio is a major hub for Tex-Mex cuisine and is home to numerous festivals and events, showcasing its diverse cultural heritage.



# Father Michael G. Ryan BUILDING A GREAT CATHEDRAL

Father Michael G. Ryan served as pastor of St. James Cathedral in Seattle for thirty-seven years. He attended the North American College in Rome, and, on December 17, 1966, was ordained a priest at St. Peter's Basilica. In 1977 Archbishop Raymond G. Hunthausen appointed him as Chancellor for the Archdiocese of Seattle and Vicar General. He served in those capacities until 1988 when the same Archbishop appointed him Pastor of St. James Cathedral. In 1994, Father Ryan oversaw the nationally acclaimed renovation and restoration of the Cathedral. Under his leadership, the Cathedral parish tripled in size, drawing families from more than 180 ZIP codes. Father Ryan has been a member of the governing board of the Cathedral Ministry Conference since its inception. On July 1, 2025, Father Ryan became Pastor Emeritus of St. James Cathedral.



# Sister Tere Maya, CCVI THE SYNOD: NOW WHAT?

Sister Teresa Maya is a member of the Congregation of the Sisters of Charity of the Incarnate Word, San Antonio. She has served as teacher, history professor, administrator, leader, facilitator and speaker. She is passionate about forming ministers committed to transforming Church and society. She believes in life-long learning and has a strong conviction in the future of consecrated life.

Sister Teresa got her B.A. at Yale University, her M.A. at the Graduate Theological Union at Berkeley and the Ph.D. in El Colegio de Mexico in Mexico City. She served fourteen years in the leadership of her religious institute and on the Leadership Conference of Women Religious (LCWR) presidency from 2016-19. She accompanies other religious congregations as facilitator and consultant.

She is currently serving as Senior Director for Theology and Sponsorship in the Catholic Health Association (USA).



# Father Ron Rolheiser, OMI THE SPIRITUALITY OF CATHEDRAL MINISTRY

Ronald Rolheiser is a Roman Catholic priest and member of the Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate. He is a community-builder, lecturer, and writer. His books are popular throughout the English-speaking world and have now been translated into many languages. His weekly column is carried by many newspapers worldwide. Before this present position, he taught theology and philosophy at Newman Theological College in Edmonton, Alberta, for 16 years, served as Provincial Superior of his Oblate Province for six years, and served on the General Council for the Oblates in Rome for six years. From 2005 – 2020, Fr. Ron served as President of the Oblate School of Theology in San Antonio Texas. He remains on staff at OST as a full-time faculty member.



#### **About the San Antonio Missions**

San Antonio is home the largest concentration of Spanish colonial missions in North America. Named the first World Heritage Site in Texas by the United Nations Organization for Education, Science and Culture (UNESCO), San Antonio Missions National Historical Park encompasses the city's four southernmost missions – Concepción, San José, San Juan and Espada. The historical park and missions are estimated to bring over one million visitors a year. All four mission churches still function as active Catholic parishes that hold regular services, making it a



destination site for not only culture, history and education but also deep faith.

El Camino de San Antonio Missions pilgrimage center, a new cultural and spiritual hub, brings new life to these historic sites by linking the four missions — and the oldest functioning Cathedral in Texas — to each other while also serving as a starting point for pilgrimage.

We will visit the Missions of Concepcion and San Jose, the Margil Pilgrimage Center, and the World Heritage Center near the San Jose Mission. Father David Garcia will be our guide.
